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PROGRAM

Students in this course will have the opportunity to practise the different skills involved in any language like reading, listening,

speaking or writing. Furthermore, lexical and grammatical areas that are relevant at a C1-level will be dealt with. The course will also

include educational components where students will be able to discover some aspects of teaching languages and communication.

The following are some examples of the content areas which will be covered in the course:

1. Lexical Areas: Phrasal verbs, education and teaching, etc.
2. Grammar structures: Conditionals, modal verbs, etc.
3. Communication skills: task completion during role playing, asking and answering questions, etc.

The overall objective of this course is to provide students with the grammatical and lexical knowledge, as well as the reading, writing,

listening and speaking skills, required for successful completion of a standardized C1-level exam (Cambridge First or EOI) in March

2027.

The classes will draw on published materials and online resources meant for that language level, and will involve active participation on

the students' part.

EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

A wide range of different exercises, activities and tasks will be used both in the classroom and outside the classroom to help students achieve a C1-level in English.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

This course has 6 ECTS, which implies up to 150-180 hours of work on the students' part, including attending lessons, doing exams and working outside the classroom.

The final exam will take about 2.5 hours, class time will imply about 37.5 hours, so you are **expected to work on your own for about 100 hours in the semester** (from September until the day of the final exam).

ASSESSMENT



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To pass this course students will need a **final grade of at least 5/10** once all the grades in the different components of the course have been added. It is NOT NECESSARY to pass all the components to pass the course, so one good mark in one component, for example in reading, will compensate a lower mark in other components, like in speaking or writing.

On the other hand, those students who **do not reach that 5/10 in the final grade** WILL HAVE TO DO A RE-SIT EXAM in the extraordinary examination period in June 2027 (segunda convocatoria).

Once the grades in the different components have been added and the final grade calculated NO OTHER EXTRA COMPONENTS will be included to add extra marks or substitute any components from the course. This means that there is **NO POSSIBILITY** for the student to do **any coursework or test not done during the semester** or to **be assessed in any other things** that are not included in the scheme below:

Evaluation Scheme (SKILLS)

Grammar and Vocabulary: 20% (based on coursebook, units 1-8) + Reading: 20% + Writing: 20% + Listening: 20% + Speaking: 20%

Evaluation Scheme (CONTINUOUS 50% vs FINAL 50%)

Writings in the semester: 10% of the final grade. 3 writings to be done in the classroom, during class time. If a student misses one or more of those writings, they will have the opportunity to do them on the day of the final exam (4th December).

Mid-term exam: 13th October at 12.00 - 30% (including Grammar and Vocabulary 10%, Listening 10% and Reading 10%)

Speaking task about education: 10% of the final grade. To be done in one of the classes in the semester.

Final oral exam: 10% of the final grade. 4th December from 9.30 to 11.00. Rooms and times for each oral exam to be announced.

Final written exam: 40% of the final grade (including Grammar and Vocabulary 10%, Listening 10%, Reading 10%, and writing 10%) - 4th December from 11.30-14.00. Examination rooms to be announced.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Please note that any attempt at fraud, copying, plagiarism, or other irregular behaviour constitutes a serious offence as set out in Title IV, 'Academic Disciplinary Rules for Students,' within the University of Navarra's Code of Conduct.

In the case of an **assignment**, such behaviour will mean **zero marks** in that assignment, whereas **fraud in an exam** (mid-term or final, written or oral) will imply **failing the course with a final grade of 0**, regardless of the marks in the other components of the course.

Students with **special educational needs** must first contact the Studies Coordination Office of the School of Education and Psychology to obtain authorisation for the necessary adjustments (e. g. extra time for exams). This authorisation must be sent by the student to the teacher. It is recommended that this be done at the beginning of the semester.

EXAM DATES

Midterm exam (13th October 2026, rooms to be confirmed).

No continuous assessment tasks to be assigned after the week of 13 November 2026.



Final oral exam (4th December 2026, 9.30 hours, rooms and times for each oral exam to be confirmed).

Final written exam (4th December 2026, 11.30 hours, rooms to be confirmed). It will be based on all the units covered in the book.

Missed writings (4 December 2026, 14:30, rooms to be confirmed). Students who miss one or more of the writing tasks during the semester must provide appropriate supporting documentation (e.g. a medical certificate or other official justification). Those students will have the opportunity to complete only the writing(s) they missed on the above date. There will be no possibility to re-do writings that have already been assessed.

RE-SIT EXAMINATION PERIOD

Those students who have failed the course in the first semester (i.e., they have less than 50% in the total of the exams and assessments of the course) will have to do a re-sit examination that will consist of an exam with the following components:

Grammar and Vocabulary: 20% (based on coursebook)

Reading: 20%

Writing: 20%

Listening: 20%

Speaking: 20%

The final grade for the academic record (acta en junio) will be the one resulting from that re-sit examination. The coursework and test done during the semester (September-December 2026) WILL NOT be considered for that grade in June 2026. This means that there is **NO POSSIBILITY** for the student to be assessed in any other aspect (no extra assignment, for example).

Those students who have already passed the course in December 2026 and want to raise their final grade, they will have the opportunity to do so in June 2027. They will have to sit an exam with the following components:

Grammar and Vocabulary: 20% (based on coursebook)

Reading: 20%

Writing: 20%

Listening: 20%

Speaking: 20%

The results obtained in that exam will appear in the academic record in June 2027 (segunda convocatoria), even if they are worse than the ones in December 2026. No assignments or coursework from the first semester will be considered for that final grade in June 2027.

The grade for the academic record (acta) will be the one in that exam, in other words, there is **NO POSSIBILITY** for the student to be assessed in any other aspect (no extra assignment, for example).
