SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

Course Requirements: You should be able to communicate effectively to English: B2 (Upper Intermediate)-C1 (Advanced) standard course.

The principal objective is to apply four main competencies (Reading, Listening, Speaking and Writing) to the linguistic knowledge and skills that students bring to the course.

I. Becoming familiar with the exam

- Understand what is required in each of the sections of the exam.
- Understand the assessment criteria for written and oral expression.
- Understand the assessment framework for all parts of the exam.

II. Using exam strategies

- Plan time management across the various parts and different components of the exam.
- Practice written expression under timed conditions.
- Study strategies and tips for each of the exam exercises.

III. Becoming accustomed to the exam

- Practice handling and using the computer-based format of the exam.



- Complete at least 1 full practice exams available in the Computer Room.

PROGRAMME

Class time covers the various requirements and guidance on how to complete the skills needed for the TOEFL exam.

As the course progresses, the student will apply these to practical requirements for completing the tasks within the time constraints of the exam for each skill set.

This will make use of the practice tests on the computers, and students will be able to monitor their progress.

Each part of the exam will be introduced, analysed and practiced during the first 6 to 7 class sessions in the classroom. This practice is reinforced with additional grammar and vocabulary exercises both in-class and also made available on ADI.

All parts of the exam are then re-examined over the remaining class sessions making use of the Computer Room to manage the requirements for Online Examination processes.

The test will be scored on a 0–6 scale for each section, and 0–6 for the total score. For a period of 18 months, the TOEFL scoring system that previously existed (pre-January 2026) will remain in place for comparison purposes. The score achieved is valid for 2 years. The following is a cross-reference of the Scoring Scales used by TOEFL before January 2026 and AFTER January 2026.
