Brief description of the course: This course analyzes the main aspects of open economy macroeconomics, focusing on the behavior of exchange rates and international capital flows.

LEARNING OUTCOMES (Competencies)

EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES

As for any course attributing 3 ECTS credits, students' workload is expected to be of about 75 hours. A tentative distribution of this preparation time is as follows:

- Lectures (asistencia a clases magistrales): 30 hours.
- Class discussions (seminarios de discusión): 1 hours.
- Case studies and practical classes (análisis de casos y actividades prácticas presenciales): 2 hours.
- Office hours (tutorías): 2 hours.
- Students' own homework (estudio personal): 37 hours.
- Proctored assignments (elaboración de trabajos dirigidos): 3 hours.

The ADI's website of the course contains class materials for both the theoretical and practical content of the course. All the material will be posted in advance for consultation even ahead of the lectures, but further questions/applications may be considered directly during the lectures.

Students will receive further indications (relationship program-bibliography, tentative class schedule, etc.) through the intranet. Possible adjustments to the program will be announced during the lectures.

The final exam in June makes up for the final exam taken in May. If a student wants to additionally try to improve the grade on the proctored assignments, he/she has to prepare new work individually and inform of his/her will to do so no later than the end of May, consequently renouncing to his/her achievements during the semester. The grade on the new work can either be higher or lower than what obtained during the semester.

DETAILS

Types of questions: multiple-choice questions (or the like), short-answer questions, problems. The exact structure of the exams will be announced during the course.

The final exam is comprehensive. *In this case, a minimum of 4/10 is required.*
