ACTIVIDADES FORMATIVAS

CLASSROOM-BASED TRAINING ACTIVITIES

Participative classes and clinical cases (0.72 ECTS, 18 hours). The aim of this methodology is for students to acquire knowledge of the philosophy of palliative care and how to care for patients with advanced disease and their families in a comprehensive manner. Students will have access to bibliography and/or work material corresponding to the classes through ADI. The classes will be developed through clinical cases that will be analysed on the basis of the autonomous study previously carried out by the student and teamwork during the classes. The lecturer will guide the discussions and, finally, clarify the theoretical bases underpinning these contents.

Number of hours: 18 hours.

The following competencies are covered: 1, 2, 3, 5, 7 and 8.

Activity at the University of Navarra Museum (0,16 ECTS, 4 hours) Students will have an activity at the University of Navarra Museum to develop the skills of self-awareness, observation and empathy when caring for palliative care patients. They will also use a creative work to express the impact of caring for people in advanced and terminal phases.

Number of hours: 4 hours.

Skills: 2, 4.

<u>Colloquium sessions</u> (0.16 ECTS, 4 hours) A meeting will be held with the support team of the Clínica Universidad de Navarra and with the Palliative Care Team of San Juan de Dios. Students will be able to get to know the different members of the team and the contribution of each of the professionals to the care of the patient. The active participation of the students will be encouraged in order to take advantage of the opportunity of this meeting.

Number of hours: 4 hours.

Written assessment (0.08 ECTS, 2 hours).

FACE-TO-FACE TRAINING ACTIVITIES



<u>Tutorials</u> (0,04 ECTS, 1 hour) Students will be able to carry out tutorials with the person in charge of the subject in order to clarify doubts, go deeper into the subject or make queries. Place: Office Edificio de los Castaños S075.

<u>Reflective work</u> (0.08 ECTS, 2 hours) Students will carry out a reflective work on a text on the lived experiences of patients with advanced disease.

Number of hours: 3 hours.

<u>Personal study and autonomous work</u> (1,68 ECTS, 42 hours) Students will have to study the contents taught in class based on and completed with the recommended bibliography. Students will be responsible for the organisation of their personal study and work.

Number of hours: 42 hours.

EVALUACIÓN

CONVOCATORIA ORDINARIA

There will be a **written tes**t to verify the knowledge acquired and how to apply it in clinical situations. Weight in the final grade: 50 %.

In addition, **reflective wor**k on the lived experiences of patients with advanced disease will be taken into account. The deadline for submission is **September 30th**. Weight in the final grade: 10 %.

There will be an **evaluation of the session at the Museum** through a reflection on what the session at the Museum has given you (maximum 100 words). Deadline for submission is **30th November**. Weight in the final grade: 10%.

Continuous evaluation in class will be taken into account as they reflect interest and dedication to the subject. Weight in the final grade: 30%.

To pass the course you must have passed at least the multiple-choice test.

CONVOCATORIA EXTRAORDINARIA

- The student that has not passed the first application, has to do a written test in June with the same characteristics of the first application. The score of the reflexive work, the reflexion from the activity of the Museum and the participation in class of the first application will be keep for the final score.
- According to the article 5 of the Real Decreto 1125/2003, the results obtained by the students will be score from 0 to 10 with the following qualitative calification
 - 0-4,9: Suspenso (SS).
 - 5,0-6,9: Aprobado (AP).
 - 7,0-8,9: Notable (NT).
 - 9,0-10: Sobresaliente (SB).
